The Malaspina Fellows Program

Students selected as Malaspina Fellows will take part in a co-curricular seminar on concepts of freedom, under the direction of AMRC Associated Scholar Dr. David Livingstone. At the completion of the seminar participants receive a small honorarium and are encouraged to submit written work to *The Compass Rose*.
