London, 12 May. The three Spanish Fregates that in 1789 went from Cadiz on a discovery voyage, have successfully returned. They examined the southern coast of America, from the Plate River to Cap Horn, and thence the western side as far as possible, and in particular if any passage bore to the Atlantic Ocean between 59 and 61 degrees of North latitude. They have confirmed the situation of the Archipelago of Admirals De Fonts and Jean de Fuca, examined the Marianna Islands, Philippines and Macao, sailed between Mindanao and New Guinea, 500 miles eastward, passed through the New Hebrides and visited New Zealand, New Holland and the archipelago of the Friendly Islands. We have every reason to expect from this voyage much information about these unknown lands.
