

Mark Waypoint Page

- 1. Press and hold the Enter button to get the *Mark Waypoint* Page. The unit will automatically assign a new waypoint name (a number, by default), and your current coordinates.
- 2. Use the Rocker pad (the large, round button in the middle), which acts like a video gamepad, to move up to the top of the form, then move right to highlight the *Waypoint Number* (012 in the example above).
- 3. Press Enter to begin editing the Waypoint Name. Use the left and right rocker controls to move character-by-character through the name. While on the character you wish to edit, use the up and down rocker controls to cycle through all the numbers and letters until you find the one you need. Press Enter when you complete the editing of the Waypoint Name.
- 4. Use the rocker to move down and highlight the *Location* (Coordinates). Press Enter to begin editing. The Zone should remain the same, and the most significant digits of the coordinates may also not need editing. Edit digits of the coordinates as necessary to create the correct waypoint coordinates. Press enter to complete the coordinate editing process.
- 5. Use the Rocker to move down and highlight the OK button. Press Enter.
- 6. Repeat until all your waypoints are entered.

**Navigating to a Waypoint**: You will need to move to each waypoint in turn and record the coordinates and codeword for each waypoint. There are many ways to use the GPS unit to move to a waypoint.

1. Press Menu twice to get to the main menu page

- 2. Use the rocker to select Points and press Enter
- 3. Select Waypoints and press Enter
- 4. You will now be viewing either the *Find Nearest*, or the *Find By Name* page. The title bar at the top will tell you which. If you are currently viewing the *Waypoints By Name* screen, press Menu, select *Find Nearest* and press Enter.
- 5. Scroll through the list of waypoints to find the waypoint you wish to visit next and press Enter
- 6. Select Goto and press Enter
