Course Outline:

An introduction to basic non-calculus mathematics useful to students in Applied Mathematics, Computing Science, Business and the Social and Biological Sciences. Topics include linear equations, matrices with applications, compound interest and annuities, sets and counting techniques, linear programming and probability. Homework: Weekly homework assignments from the textbook will be posted on the course website.

Doing practice problems is essential for learning mathematics and it is crucial that you complete and understand all assigned homework. In addition to the assigned problems, you should also attempt additional problems from the text to reinforce your understanding.

It is important that you are able to solve problems on your own; however, you are also encouraged to work together on the problem sets. Explaining your solutions to others and discussing problem solving strategies contributes enormously to your understanding. You may of course also see me for help with homework problems.

Homework will not be collected for grading, though you will be tested on the homework material. Answers to odd-numbered problems are in the back of the text.

## Math 111 – Introductory Finite Mathematics I

Tests: There will be 80 minute class tests given on the following Fridays: Sep 21, Oct 12, Nov 2 and Nov 30.

Class tests are comprehensive, covering all material since the beginning of the course. Each test is

worth 15% of your final grade.

No make-up tests will be given, but if you miss a class test for a good reason allowances may be made. Documentation must be provided to explain your absence: doctor's note in the case of illness, death certificate in the case of death in the family, police report in the case of car accident, etc. No exceptions.

Test absence due to religious observance may be accommodated, however you must notify me in

advance of the test and provide full details of the observance in question.

If you are ill on test day and you elect to write the test anyway, your grade will stand.

There will be a comprehensive final exam in December worth 40% of your grade. The exam period is **Final Exam:** 

Dec 10-19 2018. Travel plans should not be made until the final exam schedule is released, which is at least one month before exams begin. In no event will the final exam be rescheduled to

accommodate travel plans.
