(h) A line through the points $(0,0)$ and $(-3, a)$ is parallel to the line $y=-\frac{x}{3}+137$. What is the value of $a$ ?

(i) Find the slope of the line defined by the equation $x+2 y+1=-3(x-y)-7$.
(j) What is the domain of the function $f(x)=\frac{x}{\sqrt{x+1}}$ ? Use interval notation for your answer.

(q) Simplify $\frac{e^{2 x}-1}{e^{x}+1}$.
(r) Evaluate $\log _{3} \frac{1}{27}$.

(s) Solve for $x: \log _{2} 4 x+\log _{2}(2-x)=2$.
(t) Simplify: $1-x^{2} e^{\ln \left(1 / x^{2}\right)}$.

(c) $[3$ points $]$ Add to the plot above the graph of $f^{-1}(x)$.
(d) $[3$ points $]$ Find a formula for $f^{-1}(x)$.
